Sermon 18 October 2015 – Hilary Campbell

I would like to introduce you to some children.....





Bogdon*, found alone in his cot in a Romanian Hospital. Aged 7 months (*not their real names)





Adi and his baby brother Luca were rescued early last year. The youngest two of a family of 5 kids were found in the town hall, abandoned. Their solo father had sold their dirt house, so he could buy alcohol, and then left the kids in the town hall.



Stefan – abandoned, found in a hospital bed. Alone.



Gabriela – rescued in 2013 aged 2 years old. Her mum was an orphan herself and lived on the streets. Local authorities found Gabriella and have put her in our home.



Maria, rescued from her cot bed in a Romanian Hospital. The poorly made bed, a toy and a blanket. That was her living environment. She might get a visit from caregiver once a day with a bottle. Or she might not.

It was scenes like these that Sue van Schreven – saw with her own eyes, on a visit to Romania 11 years ago. This is Sue pictured here with Maria. She came home from that visit, determined to do something to help the helpless. Be a voice for the voiceless and provide love and a home for the homeless. From that, Orphans Aid International began.



As an organisation, Orphans Aid exists because of children such as these. Children – through no fault of their own, are in situations where they are abandoned, with no parents to care for them, no extended family, and therefore have been left in the care of an already full hospital.

Orphans Aid International's mission is: **To** <u>rescue</u> <u>orphaned</u> & <u>abandoned</u> <u>children</u>. **To** <u>relieve</u> <u>suffering</u>, to <u>love</u> <u>unconditionally</u> <u>wherever</u> the <u>need</u> <u>maybe</u>.

The organisation was born in Invercargill, but quickly gained support from others throughout the country. Orphans Aid's first project was to fundraise to buy a large house in Romania,





To employ loving house parents and caregivers and seek permission from the Romanian government to fill it with children rescued from hospital beds and the streets. How exciting, to be able to give some forgotten and abandoned children, a home, a family, clothing, food, warmth and shelter. It was named "Casa Kiwi" (Kiwi House)

Ironically, in 2004, at the same time, another journey was beginning, and taking flight. More accurately Craig and I were taking flight – 5 of them in fact, to get us to a small city in the middle of Russia. Craig and I started our family by way of meeting two gorgeous little souls who had a start to life with some similarities to those I mentioned above.

When we met them 11 years ago, our daughter was 5, and son was 3. They had had a rough beginning, and were currently cared for in an orphanage, one of 4 orphanages in that small city. There was no extended family to look after them, they were wards of the state.



Their future was to be brought up in that orphanage, schooled in the same building, and once they were 15, put out on the street to survive. A bleak future with no family and no one to support them.

We travelled by plane then by road, to an orphanage filled with almost 400 children.

Children - without the care and LOVE that they need and deserve.

That was 11 years ago that we adopted the kids. Well for us, we have been extremely blessed, and totally privileged by the enrichment these two kids have so far brought to our lives and we are very thankful for them, along with the other two gorgeous kiddos we have been blessed to parent.

I share this, because there are usually points in our lives that God highlights to us – to lead us in a direction. Often a direction that we couldn't have anticipated. He opens our eyes to needs that require HIS love.

Some of you will be familiar with the music of Brooke Fraser (singer and songwriter). Brooke went on a trip to Rwanda, and after meeting an orphaned girl called Albertine, she wrote the song of that same title. In it were the words:

"...Now that I have seen, I am responsible"

Oh how true are those words. God purposely guides us to see people/situations through eyes like his own. Seeing needs......., seeing something that pulls on our hearts....... Something we feel compassionate enough about to try and DO something about. Many of you I know, will have had an experience such as this.

For me this was exactly the same. I had seen not only two beautiful little beings who were soon to become our own, but also God had shown me needs like I had never seen before and I felt responsible to do something about it.

Soon after returning home, I heard about the work of Orphans Aid International, and along with their programme of rescuing children in Romania, they were now also providing care, love, food and daily experiences for vulnerable kids in a city in Russia, Kids who spent their days and nights on the streets, kids whose parents were in prison. Kids from orphanages. Kids with extreme need.

This pricked my curiosity, with our new link to Russia and so our involvement in Orphans Aid began.

After volunteering in a variety of roles over the years, I now manage the Dunedin Op Shop, located in King Edward St, South Dunedin.



We have learned that Op Shops are a great way for us to fundraise.

We have 3 Op Shops around the country now Invercargill, Hastings and Dunedin. And a head office and Fair Trade shop in Queenstown.

Clearly our main aim is to fundraise money we can use on our overseas projects, However, we have realised that our Op shop's purpose for being, is not only that. There is another significant purpose and that is to provide a base for local people to purchase affordable clothes and household goods.

Many locals seem to love coming into our shop, to chat to our wonderful volunteers, occasionally share their ups and downs, and to find a place they can get the basics they need for affordable prices. We also give away items and vouchers to people in need as we hear about them, and enjoy sharing the love we can, with people close to home, as well as far away. Our local giving is often through the avenues of other helping agencies in the city that we support so together we can get the right things to the people who need them.

As the years have gone on, Sue has seen more overseas needs that require help.



we support a Doctor who provides free medical care to people living on the streets. We also feed hundreds of kids and families each day at 10 different feeding stations around Kolkutta.

Such happy endings for children who were abandoned. The abandoned, rescued.

You know, kids like these aren't the only ones who need rescued.

In Roman's 8 it says: WE all are orphans before becoming part of the family of Christ. God is the Father of adoption.... He adopted us.... Paul uses adoption to illustrate our new relationship with God. Being chosen, being loved unconditionally, and gaining all there is to gain by being a child of God's.

We have been taken from one family, the family of sin and death, and adopted by another family, the family of righteousness and eternal life.

In Ephesians, Paul says, that God 'chose' us. Even before HE made the world, He Chose us, according to his plan. His plan has always been to grow HIS family and to have us in it! All we have to do is believe it and accept it.

Eph 1:5 – His unchanging plan has always been to adopt us into his own family, by sending Jesus Christ to die for us. And he did this because he wanted to!"

How can we spread this message around the world?

We are all familiar with how precious children are in God's eyes. We are also no doubt familiar with many verses in the bible teaching us to love and care for the poor, the needy, the orphans, and the widows. Probably the most well known being: *James 1:27*.

So where to from here? Perhaps God is opening our eyes to a portion of our society, or our global society who need our help. As we all know there are people in our everyday paths that need to see and feel God's love around them. We can be Jesus's hands and feet to the people in our communities, workplaces, neighbourhood, church, so they may receive God's love.

We can also support international organisations (and there are many!) to allow the people on the ground in those countries around the world who are reaching out and being the hands and feet to those in need and those who are yet to experience God's love.

May we all also have our eyes wide open to who God is, where HE is, what He has done for us, HOW loved we are, and in all things may we remember to be thankful that we were chosen to be adopted into Christs's family. Thankful for what we have been given, and be willing to share that with others around us.

Open our eyes and our hearts to the people around us who need to know your love.

Guide our hearts as to how we give and serve you in this area.
