Some Facts about the Garden at Leith Valley

We have, and have had, a number of great gardeners amongst our congregation and they have influenced the gardens around Leith Valley Church to its great benefit.

- Lex Smith was a keen plantsman and planted the Rata tree in the back corner of the garden, he also planted (with permission) some of the trees in the Woodhaugh gardens.
- A number of the Rhododendrons dotted around the front garden were donated by Jim Stephenson's family after he died.
- The Rimu, Silver Birch and Magnolia trees were all donated by Colin & Chris Fitzpatrick. The very large kowhai tree in their garden, which over hangs our carpark, is estimated to be 170 years old and is a protected tree.
- The Apple Tree has just had a long overdue prune back thank you guys! it, and the plum tree behind it, will be well over 50 years old as they were part of the garden for the house which stood on the section before the church was built there.
- The dahlias came from Fran's mother's garden and have been flowering every autumn since they were planted in the early 2000's

And big thanks to those who come and weed and mow the lawns and generally tidy up!
