Just look at what happens when some wise men hear about the birth of Jesus: And when they [the wise men] saw the star, they were so ecstatic that they should and celebrated with unrestrained joy. When they came into the house and saw the young child with Mary, his mother, they were overcome. Falling to the ground at his feet they worshiped him. Then they opened their treasure boxes full of gifts and presented him with gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Matthew 2:10-11 TPT

For hundreds of years, people had been waiting. Waiting on God to fulfill His promise to send our Saviour. And Christmas is one of the best reminders that God keeps His promises. He sent us Jesus as the ultimate gift to show that God wants to be with us.

The wise men celebrated with unrestrained joy. They were overcome. They fell to their feet and did the only thing you can do when faced with that much wonder—worshiped.

This Christmas, instead of focusing on what you need to do, worship God for what He has done for you. Instead of focusing on what you lack, focus on God's love.




